

## **Vastu- Some interesting case studies**

The readers must have by now gained some knowledge on the basic concept of Vastu through my earlier articles. Here are some of the case studies which will be not only interesting but quite intriguing.

**India:** Though India is a country of ancient origin with enviable culture, tradition, languages and literature, its history has been, from Mahabhartha to Kargil, full of invasions, wars and domestic conflicts. The advocates of Vastu attribute this to the high Himalayas in the north and low water body the Arabic sea where it should be the other way around, here, the culprit being the Nature itself.

One of the examples cited for good Vastu is Israel. This is because, its east and south are fortified by desert and sea respectively although scattered water bodies in the north.

Having said this, I find several countries like Canada, Russia and even U S A do not seem to agree with this analysis.

**Temples:** The two temples normally compared are the Sri Balaji temple at Tirupathi hills and Sri Kalahasti temple at the downhill. Though, both the temples were initiated by the same Zachary, almost at the same time, Kalahasti temple did not reach the fame, eminence and the ever-growing glory of the abode of Sri Balaji.

Sri Balaji temple is surrounded by elevated hilly slopes leaving the north east Eassanyam open for the cosmic energies to flow in freely. This is further fortified by the temple pond located exactly in the Eassanyam. Whereas, in the Kalahasti temple the external factors are just opposite to what we see in the hill temple.

Among other archeological centers the world famous Taj Mahal, knowingly or unknowingly is in possession of excellent Vastu.
